



# Discipleship in the Home



## Morning Time



Can you think of someone who might need your help (service) today?



Who do you know that might need your help (service) today?



Did you serve someone yesterday? Tell me about it. What are some ways you can serve someone today?



## Driving Time



Some cars are for serving other people. Do you know what kinds of cars serve others and can you find any as we drive? (Taxis and buses provide service.)



There are lots of vehicles that serve people. Do you know what they are and can you see any? (Taxis, buses, ambulances, etc.)



What did you talk about in small group? (How and why Jesus washed the disciples' feet.)



## Dinner Time



For dinner today, each person will do something to serve another. How can we each do something to serve? (Bring someone's plate to the table, help make someone else's sandwich, pull out a chair, etc.)



What can you tell me about how the Bible is organized? (The Bible is divided into two main parts: Old Testament and New Testament. Each Testament is made up of books. Each book is divided into chapters, and the chapters are divided into verses.)



Ask your child to serve by helping prepare the meal, set the table, serve the food, etc.



## Night Time



One way we can serve others is by praying for them. Who do you know that needs us to pray for them?



What did Jesus do in this week's lesson that was unusual? (He washed His disciples' feet.) Why? (He wanted to show them that it is important to serve others.)



Share with your child how you serve your family and colleagues at work or in other places.
