



Discipleship in the Home



Morning Time



The Bible says Jesus died for us. Why do you think He would die for you? (Because He loves each of us that much.)



What do you think of when you see a cross? (The cross is where Jesus showed us how much He loves us. The cross is where Jesus died for us.)



As a parent, how does Christ's loving sacrifice affect how you live your daily life? Share with your child a way you try to reflect the love of Christ each day.



Driving Time



We see lots of signs when we drive. Signs have shapes and symbols that help us know what to do. What does a cross shape say to us?



What do you think it means to sin? (To sin is to disobey God. Sin has a big consequence, separation from God. Jesus died so that we don't have to be separated from God.)



What did you talk about in your small group? (The crucifixion of Christ.) What do you remember about the story?



Dinner Time



This week you learned that Jesus did something very special for us. What was that? (He died for us.)



Jesus never sinned, why did Jesus have to die? (Jesus died for our sin.)



Share with your child what Christ's death means to you. Allow each person at the meal to share what it means to them.



Night Time



Jesus died for us so that we could have a home in heaven. What do you think heaven will be like for us?



Jesus loves us so much that He came to die for us. Who should we tell about Jesus' love for them? (We should tell anyone God leads us to tell.) Let's pray that God will help us tell others this week about His love.



In our story this week, we saw that Jesus died and that's a terrible and sad thing. But, Jesus' death is also a good thing. Do you know why it was good? (Jesus' death paid the price for our sin so we can be forgiven.)
